FACULTY MEMBER DIES FROM HEART ATTACK

A Truly Great Man, He Most Certainly Was,
For His Mind Was So Grand, His Patience So Lasting;
This Is Our Tribute to Mr. Jack Bass

Mr. Jack Bass was born July 14, 1920 in Carbondale, Illinois. This date is also the birthdate of France's independence, the country whose language he loved so much. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree at Southern Illinois University and went into graduate work at Iowa. Upon completion of this advanced work, he began teaching and in September, 1954, he started teaching at Lincoln High School.



MR. JACK BASS, Lincolnite advisor, teacher, and friend of all, was the victim of a fatal heart attack Thursday, May 12. Memorial services were held here Friday at 8 p. m. Burial was in Oakland cemetery in Carbondale, Illinois.

Mr. Bass was an excellent example of a truly good teacher, of a teacher whose influence remained steadfast long after he had left the classroom. During his six years here at Lincoln High School, Mr. Bass has earned and received an everlasting respect from all who knew him. With those of us who were fortunate enough to know him, he will remain a lasting impression of a good-natured, genial man.

He was a man whose patience knew no boundaries; a man who knew how to laugh and how to

make others laugh by the use of his phenomenal wit; a man who taught English, French, American History and American Problems and presented these diversified courses in such a manner that they could be readily comprehended by everyone.

It is difficult to describe all the many wonderful qualities of this fine man who we all loved so much. However, it is easy to say, that his memory will remain fresh for years to come; a man who has served humanity and posterity — "Rest In Peace".
